

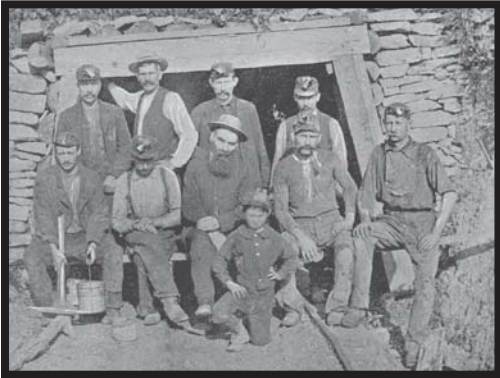

## COAL CREEK MINERS MUSEUM TO HOST COAL MINERS REUNION

The Coal Creek Miners Museum will be hosting a Coal Miners Reunion on April 29, 2017 from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Lake City Middle School in Rocky Top, TN to honor the miners that worked in the Tennessee, Kentucky and West Virginia coal mines.

"The museum's purpose is to honor the miners and the impact that they had on our communities and now we want to host an event to bring the miners together to reconnect to each other and honor them for their years of hard work," said Tim Isbel, Chairperson of the Coal Creek Miners Museum.

There will be chili and soups, live music, door prizes, t-shirts for sale and script vendors will be on hand to sale and trade script. At 5:00 p.m. there will be a program to honor the hard working men and women who mined coal. Tickets are \$5 per person and can be purchased at the Coal Creek Miners Museum, Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., online at [www.coalcreekminersmuseum.com](http://www.coalcreekminersmuseum.com) or at the door at the event. However, because of a generous donation, admission is free for anyone that has worked in a mine.

In addition, the Coal Creek Miners Museum will be hosting guided tours of the historical sites in Coal Creek and historians will be on hand at the Coal Creek Miners Museum from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. to welcome visitors and talk about the historical events that made coal mining in Coal Creek unique.

The guided tours to historical sites include stops at Militia Hill where the militia was stationed during the Coal Creek War, Briceville Community Church and Leach Cemetery where Fraterville Miners' Circle is located.

The guided tours of the historical sites and admission to the museum are free but you will need to make a reservation for the tour by calling 865-340-3269.

All proceeds from this event will go to fund the remodel of the second floor and installation of an elevator to access the second floor of the Coal Creek Miners Museum's building.

Randy has worked as a construction worker and custom woodworker for many years but it was after he turned 50 years old and his wife, Angela, asked him to make her a swing that he decided to try and make a living doing custom woodwork for himself. Eventually, people started asking Randy to build other things including but not limited to, cars, trucks, construction equipment, doll closets, hope chests, airplanes and more. He has even built wood fishing rods and reels! After everyone began to see how talented Randy was, his sister-in-law told him to try and find out how to get selected to have a shop at Dollywood during their Harvest Festival in October. After submitting his work, Randy was selected to bring his work to Dollywood

and set up this past year. It was there that Randy met Mr. Ray Castro, Director of the classic tv show, "The Walton's". Mr. Castro talked with Randy for awhile and during their conversation he asked Randy if he could build a replica of the Walton's Home for their upcoming 45th Anniversary Reunion. After, 800 tireless hours of working with cedar, poplar, whitewood, cherry, ambrosia maple and engineered sheeting, Randy created this beautiful replica of the Walton's home. He and his wife traveled to Schuyler, Virginia with his masterpiece that went on display and were even able to meet several members of the "The Walton's" cast.

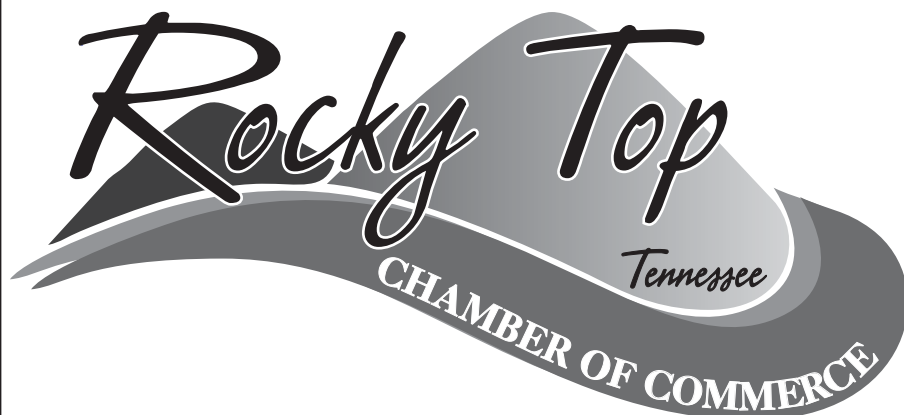

## Free Tax Return Preparation Rocky Top Public Library

Trained volunteers can help you with special credits, such as Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly for which you may qualify. In addition to **FREE** tax return preparation assistance, the **Rocky Top Public Library** site also offers free electronic filing (e-filing).

Items you need to bring to the VITA Site to have your tax returns prepared

- Proof of identification
- Health Insurance information
- Social Security Cards for you, your spouse and dependents and/or a Social Security Number verification letter issued by the Social Security Administration
- Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents on the tax return
- Current year's tax package if you received one
- Wage and earning statement(s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, from all employers
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)
- A copy of last year's Federal and State returns if available
- Bank Routing Numbers and Account Numbers for Direct Deposit
- Total paid for day care provider and the day care provider's tax identifying number (the provider's Social Security Number or the provider's business Employer Identification Number)
- To file taxes electronically on a married filing joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms.
- It is extremely important that each person use the correct Social Security Number (SSN). The most accurate information is usually located on your original Social Security card.

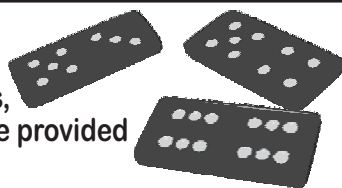
