

Coal Miners Reunion Saturday, April 28th

The Coal Creek Miners Museum will be hosting a Coal Miners Reunion on April 28th, 2018 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Clinch River Baptist Church in Rocky Top, TN to honor the miners that worked in the Tennessee, Kentucky and West Virginia coal mines.

"The museum's purpose is to honor the miners and the impact that they had on our communities and now we want to host an event to bring the miners together to reconnect to each other and honor them for their years of hard work," said Tim Isbel, Chairperson of the Coal Creek Miners Museum. "This event is not just for the miners but also for the communities that grew because of coal."

There will be a spaghetti dinner, live music, scrip vendors, a live dessert auction, door prizes including \$100 cash prizes and t-shirts for sale. At 6:00 p.m. there will be a program to honor the hard working men and women who mined coal. Tickets are \$5 per person and can be purchased at the Coal Creek Miners Museum, Monday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., online at www.coalcreekminersmuseum.com or at the door at the event.

In addition, the Coal Creek Miners Museum will be hosting guided tours of the historical sites in Coal Creek and historians will be on hand at the Coal Creek Miners Museum from 12 noon to 4:00 p.m. to welcome visitors and talk about the historical events that made coal mining in Coal Creek unique.

The guided tours to historical sites include stops at Militia Hill where the militia was stationed during the Coal Creek War, Briceville Community Church and Leach Cemetery where Fraterville Miners' Circle is located.

The guided tours of the historical sites and admission to the museum are free but reservations for the tour are recommended by calling 865-340-3269.

All proceeds from this event will go to fund the remodel of the second floor at the Coal Creek Miners Museum and museum operations.





Youth Ambassadors Meet with Lt. Governor Randy McNally Students from Clinton, Anderson and Oak Ridge High Schools attend Day on the Hill

Nashville, TN, February 28, 2018 – ASAP of Anderson Youth Ambassadors met with Lt. Governor Randy McNally yesterday as part of Prevention Alliance of Tennessee (PAT) Day on the Hill. Students from Anderson County High School, Clinton High School, and Oak Ridge High School went to the Tennessee State Capitol in Nashville to speak with the Lt. Governor about substance misuse prevention in our community. The students brought up several issues including concerns about electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS), tobacco, fentanyl, opioids and marijuana. Lt. Governor McNally listened intently as each student gave facts about personal accounts to illustrate the effects of these substances and suggested policy improvements to keep themselves, their fellow students and their community safe and healthy.

In addition, Youth Ambassadors also expressed their concerns and had their voices heard in meetings with both Representative John Ragan and Representative Dennis Powers. The students strongly advocated for primary prevention of substance misuse in Anderson County and across Tennessee.

PAT Day on the Hill is an annual event that coordinates anti-drug coalitions from across Tennessee to advocate for prevention and educate policy makers on the importance of prevention and how Tennessee's coalitions like ASAP are making a difference and showing strong return on investment for primary prevention dollars. In Anderson County, for every dollar spent on primary prevention there is a return of \$17.73.

Free Tax Return Preparation Rocky Top Public Library


Trained volunteers can help you with special credits, such as Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly for which you may qualify. In addition to **FREE** tax return preparation assistance, the **Rocky Top Public Library** site also offers free electronic filing (e-filing).

Items you need to bring to the VITA Site to have your tax returns prepared

- Proof of identification
- Health Insurance information
- Social Security Cards for you, your spouse and dependents and/or a Social Security Number verification letter issued by the Social Security Administration
- Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents on the tax return
- Current year's tax package if you received one
- Wage and earning statement(s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, from all employers
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)
- A copy of last year's Federal and State returns if available
- Bank Routing Numbers and Account Numbers for Direct Deposit
- Total paid for day care provider and the day care provider's tax identifying number (the provider's Social Security Number or the provider's business Employer Identification Number)
- To file taxes electronically on a married filing joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms.
- It is extremely important that each person use the correct Social Security Number (SSN). The most accurate information is usually located on your original Social Security card.
