# Cancer Survivors Invited to Kick Off American Cancer Society Festival of Hope



On Friday, June 15th, the American Cancer Society Festival of Hope for Anderson County will kick off the 2018 event at Melton Lake Park in Oak Ridge at 6:00 PM. Area cancer survivors and their families or caregivers are invited to come as early as 5:00 PM to check in at the Survivor's Tent which will be located near the picnic pavilion. The Survivor Ceremony allows the public the opportunity to cheer on our area cancer survivors as they are recognized and then walk in the special Survivors Lap, a moving experience honoring those who have defeated cancer and encouraging those who are currently battling cancer. Survivors will join together to walk the lap, unified in victory and hope. This empowering celebration is just a small piece of the special experience at the Festival of Hope. The teams participating in the 2018 Festival of Hope event will then take part in the Parade of Teams where teams will walk in their various themed shirts and costumes.

Festival of Hope and Relay For Life events are a unique grassroots fundraising event in which individuals and teams of participants in over 6,100 communities nationwide come together to celebrate the lives of those who have faced cancer, remember loved ones lost, and commit to fight back against the disease. The money raised through these events supports the efforts of the American Cancer Society to create a world with less cancer and more birthdays.

All area cancer survivors are invited to participate in the survivor ceremony at the Anderson County Festival of Hope at Melton Lake Park. Cancer survivors, their families and caregivers are invited to spend the evening enjoying the festivities of music, food, games, entertainment and an auction as we all come together as a community fighting against cancer. There will also be the luminaria ceremony at 9:00 PM to honor cancer survivors and remember our loved ones who have lost their battle to cancer.



## Hill Cave Tours Resume

We are thrilled to have tours back to Hill Cave, located along the shoreline of Norris Lake!

After a short boat ride, only 10 guests at a time, on the parks pontoon boat, you will spend approximately 45 minutes penetrating the cave over 1000 feet. This wild cave is a perfect "first ever" cave experience. After entering the cave via a 30" x 30" opening in the gate <<opening located at ground level>> the first excitement is entering the flooded portion of the cave.....yes the water is about 4' deep and you must walk in the water for about 75', then you will come out to walk along a pathway. Before reaching the turnaround, there is a second "water walk" the same depth, 4 FEET DEEP! The level of the lake determines the depth. If you cannot walk in 70 degree water up past your waste, this tour is not for you



Most of the cave is large enough to drive a truck in. One room has a ceiling of over 45 feet. The only low ceiling is at the entrance. A helmet is suggested along with a hands off light. Brand new batteries and a quality light will make this experience so much better as you view off into the fissures of the cave. Lightweight gloves will help as you move along beside the cave walls.

Upon exiting the cave, we want you to have some extra shoes and trash bag, to change into. To keep our boat as clean as possible, plastic sheeting will be covering the seats for the return trip. YOU WILL BE MUDDY.

No ropes or crawling are involved in this tour after getting past the gate. Caution crawling up the rocky bank can be a challenge outside the cave entrance.

## RKEY VULTURES AT NORRIS DAM STATE PARK

Here at Norris Dam State Park we have a healthy population of Turkey Vultures (Cathartes aura) that can be seen in flight quite regularly. These large birds grow up to 28 inches with an impressive 6 ft. wingspan, which certainly attracts attention while in flight. Turkey Vultures are misunderstood by many but benefit our ecosystem through the removal of dead or dying animals, effectively reducing the spread of illness and disease. They are the only vulture with a keen

sense of smell and a strongly developed immune system, attracting the attention of less keenly developed vultures, such as the Black Vulture. Though they spend most of the year roosting in large congregations, from dozens to hundreds of individuals, breeding season begins in March and continues through June. Vultures play an intense game of "follow the leader" during their courtship, where one bird takes flight making dramatic twists and turns along the way while the



other follows behind replicating flight patterns. This ritual can go on over the course of several hours and once a mated pair has found each other they, typically, stay together for life.

Turkey vultures prefer cool nest areas far away from human activity and they do not build their own nests for egg laying. They are resourceful animals that take advantage of their surroundings; choosing abandoned stick nests (built by other birds), mammal burrows, hollow logs, rock crevices, and caves to raise their young. Perhaps this is why Norris Dam has such a healthy population of vultures; as the limestone of our region provides conditions suitable for the development of caves and open rock crevices. The young hatchlings pictured above were found in one of our undisclosed caves; as vultures often reuse the same nesting sites year after year this cave is off limits to the public. Vultures can lay up to three eggs but usually lay two eggs with a 28-40 day incubation period. Both parents work together incubating the eggs and then feed their young once they have hatched. The nesting period takes about 60-84 days and once the young vultures have reached 12 weeks old they are on their own. Though their population is currently stable and growing, they are susceptible to death by poisons and lead found in decaying bodies. We should exercise caution using poisons to ward off pests and ensure hunted animals are removed to avoid led exposure to non-targeted animals. For more information check out the National Audubon Society and Cornell Lab of Ornithology.

Anderson County, TN, May 2018 – With the rapid emergence of the opioid crisis, it is now more important than ever for people to know how to find quality care. ASAP of Anderson's mission is to prevent and reduce substance misuse among youth and adults in Anderson County. One of ASAP's values is knowledge. It is important for individuals to know and understand what quality treatment looks like and how to access to the care they need.

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) outlines five signs of a quality treatment:

- 1. Accreditation
- 2. FDA Approved Medication
- 3. Evidence-Based Practices
- 4. Family Member Inclusion in the treatment process
- 5. Ongoing treatment and support beyond just treating the substance issues

These signs can be used to help decide about the quality of a treatment provider and the types of services offered. Overall, quality programs should offer a range of services accepted as effective in treatment and recover from substance use disorders and should be matched to a person's needs.

In addition, ASAP recommends high risk individuals seek Narcan, the FDA approved nasal form of naloxone, for the emergency treatment of a known or suspected opioid overdose. Narcan counteracts life-threatening effects of opioid overdose. ASAP offers FREE Narcan kits through training to at risk individuals and community members.
