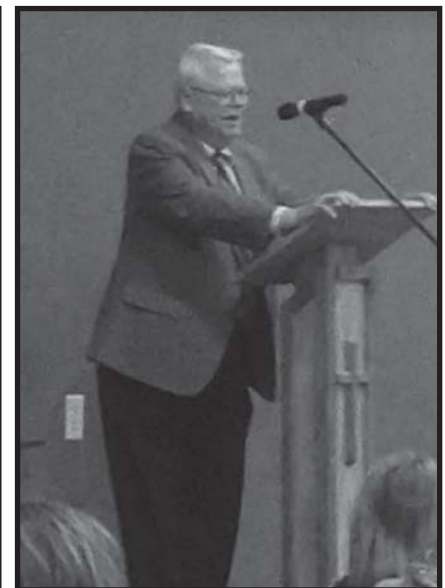

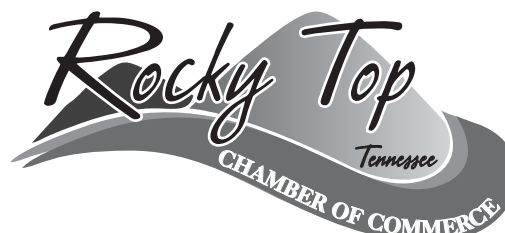

Tennessee Tree Day March 21st

(Tennessee Environmental Council press release) Tennessee residents are invited to beautify their properties and their communities by planting trees on Tennessee Tree Day, March 21, 2020. Trees are available to reserve for a \$2.49 donation or \$4.99 per tree depending on species now through March 1st or while supplies last.

Visit the event website at www.tectn.org/TennesseeTreeDay for a list of participating tree pick-up locations statewide. The event is organized by Tennessee Environmental Council in its effort to maintain a healthy tree canopy in communities across Tennessee. Native tree species available statewide will vary by pick-up location and may include: Bald Cypress, Elderberry, Northern Red Oak, Southern Red Oak, Bur Oak, Nuttall Oak, Pecan, Persimmon, Virginia Pine, Eastern White Pine, Loblolly Pine, Eastern Redbud, Red Mulberry, Staghorn Sumac, Sycamore, Tulip Poplar, Wild Plum, PawPaw, American Hazelnut, Buttonbush, and Indigo bush. Check local pick-up locations for tree species available in your area. All trees must be picked up on the dates and locations published on the event website. There are 115 volunteer-run tree pick-up locations set up across Tennessee. This event typically draws tens of thousands of volunteers who plant their trees at their homes, farms, businesses, neighborhoods and other locations of their choosing.

"We are thrilled each year to make trees available for the people of Tennessee to beautify their properties and participate in the largest community-tree-planting event in America," says Jeffrey Barrie, CEO of Tennessee Environmental Council. "The benefits to our families, our environment, and our communities are priceless, and last for generations, as Tennesseans watch their trees grow year after year," says Barrie. "The Tennessee Department of Agriculture, Division of Forestry is proud to partner with the Tennessee Environmental Council in promoting the many benefits of planting trees through the Tennessee Tree Day event. Many of the trees that will be planted have been grown at our East Tennessee Nursery in Polk County and are specifically adapted to the Tennessee climate. Our trees help to provide clean water and wildlife habitat. We are very grateful to be a part of this annual event," says Heather Slayton, Assistant State Forester with Tennessee Division of Forestry.

Tennessee Environmental Council's Tree Program was established in 2007 with a goal of planting one million native trees across the state to help repopulate trees lost to development and other causes and increase biodiversity. The organization has planted over 640,000 trees since 2007 fulfilling the mission to educate and advocate for the conservation and improvement of Tennessee's environment, communities, and public health. 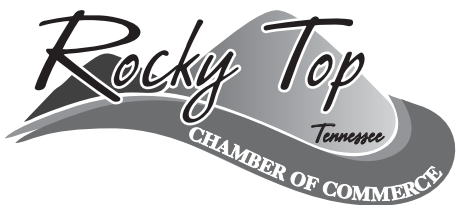

Free Tax Return Preparation Rocky Top Public Library

We will start scheduling appointments beginning January 27th.
To make an appointment you may call the library @ 865-426-6762.

Trained volunteers can help you with special credits, such as Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly for which you may qualify. In addition to FREE tax return preparation assistance, the Rocky Top Public Library site also offers free electronic filing (e-filing).



Items you need to bring to the VITA Site to have your tax returns prepared:

- Proof of identification • Health Insurance information • Current year's tax package if you received one • Social Security Cards for you, your spouse and dependents and/or a Social Security Number verification letter issued by the Social Security Administration • Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents on the tax return • Wage and earning statement(s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, from all employers
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099) • A copy of last year's Federal and State returns if available
- Bank Routing Numbers and Account Numbers for Direct Deposit • Total paid for day care provider and the day care provider's tax identifying number (the provider's Social Security Number or the provider's business Employer Identification Number) • To file taxes electronically on a married filing joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms. • It is extremely important that each person use the correct Social Security Number (SSN). The most accurate information is usually located on your original Social Security card.

Rocky Top City Manager earns Certified Public Manager Designation

Rocky Top City Manager Michael Foster recently completed the Certified Public Manager (CPM) program. Participants of the program, based in the UT Institute for Public Service's Naifeh Center for Effective Leadership, graduated in late January at the Capitol Building in Nashville.

In addition to 300 hours of in-class and online work, participants must complete a capstone project. Foster's project was City of Rocky Top Strategic Plan.

Twenty-five participants from local, state, and federal government positions graduated as members of the program's 2019 class. In just its second year, the Tennessee CPM program had cohorts in both Knoxville and Nashville. The Knoxville class graduated nine participants while Nashville graduated 16.

The ceremony included an address from Tennessee Secretary of State Tre Hargett.

"I am confident the CPM graduates are not only going to make a positive difference on the future of our state but will inspire others to a higher level of performance as well," Hargett said. "I know this program will yield great dividends for Tennessee."

Participants in the yearlong program learn about current trends in public management by hearing from subject-matter experts with experience in the field.

The program helps participants gain proficiency in seven fundamental areas: personal and organizational integrity, self-development, work management, public service, leadership of people, change leadership, and systemic integration.

The Tennessee CPM program is accredited by the National Certified Public Manager Consortium and available to UT employees.

ASAP of Anderson Offers FREE Opioid Overdose Trainings Individuals and agencies can receive life-saving education and a Narcan kit

Clinton, TN February 2020 — The opioid overdose death rate in Anderson County has decreased 47% between 2017 and 2018.

Naloxone, or Narcan, is a proven tool in the battle against drug misuse and opioid overdose deaths. Naloxone can reverse a potentially fatal situation by allowing a person to temporarily breathe again for a period of 30-90 minutes following an opioid overdose.

ASAP of Anderson is responsible for Naloxone training, branded as Opioid Overdose Training, for Anderson, Campbell, Claiborne, Grainger, Morgan, Roane, Scott, and Union Counties in Tennessee. The training is conducted by a Regional Overdose Prevention Specialist (ROPS) and any individual or organization can request a FREE training.

Requesting an Opioid Overdose training is simple:

1. Visit www.asapofanderson.org/naloxone
2. Complete a brief online registration form
3. A trained ROPS will respond to get a training scheduled for an organization or individual

It is important to note almost 90% of individuals who die of an overdose experience a nonfatal overdose in the prior 12 months; as such, members of the public who know someone that recently survived an overdose are specifically encouraged to schedule an Opioid Overdose Training. ASAP regularly partners with individuals, police departments, fire departments, places of worship, businesses and other entities to deliver this education and Narcan kits to help save lives.
