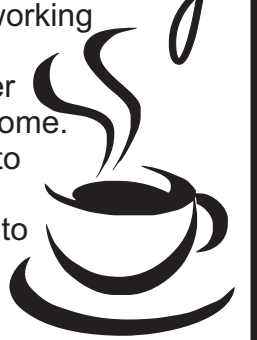

**THIS IS IMPORTANT! WE NEED YOUR HELP!**

Tennessee has published draft standards for social studies, which delete most references to Tennessee history from its required curriculum, including the Coal Creek Saga. Instead, Tennessee History will be an elective in high school, but again the Coal Creek Labor Saga has been deleted. Implementation will take place in the 2019-2020 school year.

We believe Tennessee History should be incorporated into U.S. History in each appropriate grade, not merely as an elective in high school. The Coal Creek Saga was an important part of Tennessee and American history, so it should remain in the standards.

Where else but in Coal Creek could you find carpetbaggers and scalawags becoming partners in business with skilled legal immigrants (Welsh miners and iron puddlers) to help East Tennessee rebuild after the Civil War? In the process, they taught new job skills to native Tennesseans, including former slaves. When the system became corrupted by convict leasing—a Jim Crow Law allowed by the Tennessee Constitution of 1870—Coal Creek miners captured convict stockades in Briceville, Coal Creek, and Oliver Springs to disrupt convict leasing and raise public awareness about the practice. Coal Creek miners were instrumental in ending convict leasing at a time when prison, labor, and civil rights activists failed in such attempts, thus making Tennessee the first Southern state to do so.
