

The Fraterville Mine Explosion exhibit at the Museum of East Tennessee History contains an image of Jacob Vowell's farewell letter, which states how Powell Harmon's watch is in Andy Woods' hands. It's a wonderful exhibit, but it contains no original artifacts from the explosion. That's all about to change.

Barb Titus, the great-granddaughter of Powell Harmon, will be donating Powell's watch—yes, the one that was in Andy Woods' hands—to the museum. Sisters Louise Nelson and Marie Morts will be donating their grandfather David Dezern's oil lamp that was recovered from his cap after the explosion. David perished with his four brothers and two brothers-in-law in the explosion.

Students from Briceville Elementary School, descendants of Fraterville miners, and the general public are invited to a dedication ceremony at the Museum of East Tennessee History, 601 S Gay St, Knoxville, TN 37902, on Friday, September 8th at 10:00 am. Please join us and learn about the amazing journeys these artifacts took on their way to the museum.

Artifacts from Powell Harmon and David Dezern will be invaluable additions to the Fraterville Mine Explosion exhibit. We hope it inspires other descendants to add to the collection by donating personal artifacts of Fraterville miners.



Free Event Teaches Women The Basics Of Fly Fishing

NORRIS—Women on the Water, a free special event for women who want to learn fly fishing, will be Saturday, September 23rd, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., hosted by the Clinch River Chapter of Trout Unlimited.

The women's event, partly funded by a grant from the Tennessee Valley Authority, is part of the celebration of National Public Lands Day. It will take place at Miller Island Public Access Area on the Clinch.

Participants will receive instruction in fly casting, fly tying, knot tying, water safety and the insects eaten by trout; from noon to 3:00 p.m., women will wade the river and fish with volunteer guides. It's all free, lunch will be included and fishing equipment will be available for students who don't have their own.

Enrollment is limited and pre-registration is required to ensure plentiful supplies of food and gear — to sign up, contact Melissa Maples-Harrell at tleo2008@live.com or (865) 804-5491.



River Cleanup Collects More Than A Ton of Trash

Nearly 2,200 pounds of trash plus 75 tires were hauled out of the Clinch River by the 103 volunteers who worked this summer's Fifth Annual Big Clinch River Cleanup, sponsored by the Clinch River Chapter of Trout Unlimited. During the communitywide effort on July 22nd, the Clinch River tailwater was cleaned from Miller Island to Peach Orchard Access; additionally, the shoreline was cleaned from Norris Dam to Miller Island. Collected from the river and its banks were 71 bags of litter, a big truckload of metal and the 75 tires - bringing the total of tires removed from the river and its banks to more than 7,500 since the chapter started river cleanups in the late 1990s. Miscellaneous objects removed this year included an auto gas tank, a street sign with post, the front end of a Jeep and a child's dental retainer. Volunteers hailed from 30 ZIP codes, including Texas and California; they included a squad of Boy Scouts and a heartening number of families with children. As in previous years, Big Cleanup 2017 started with breakfast on the picturesque grounds of the Museum of Appalachia (expenses of the meal were supported by a grant from the Tennessee Valley Authority). From there, volunteers set out in teams to attack debris along the Clinch. Above the water line, workers walked along riverside roads and through parking areas, gathering trash. In shallow water, volunteers wearing waders patrolled for litter. In kayaks and canoes, volunteers worked between Massengill Bridge and the Peach Orchard boat ramp to clean shorelines and shallow water where there is no access by road. Those in powerboats hauled tires and other items from the depths. Support for all the teams was supplied by volunteering emergency medical people, ham radio operators, tire disposal professionals and volunteers with trucks who collected and disposed of filled trash bags. Rusty Hallett of Norris, chairman of this year's cleanup, called the results amazing. Thanking the volunteers, Hallett said, "It is a good feeling to know that you have done something worthwhile while asking nothing in return except the satisfaction of making a small portion of the world better. "The Clinch River is the reason my wife and I moved to Norris. We both enjoy the river, we fish, we kayak, we walk the Songbird Trail. The river has become a center point of my life—I am so grateful for people who are willing to help keep it beautiful! "Most people think Trout Unlimited is a fishing club," Hallett said. "Well, most of us do love to fish—but the main focus of TU is conservation. Our goal is to make rivers and lakes more sustainable and available for everyone to use. We are not only fishermen and fisherwomen, we are very much conservationists." The Big Clinch River Cleanup got its start in 2013, an expansion of river cleanups conducted by the Clinch River Chapter since the late 1990s. Chapter member Buzz Buffington said he started the cleanups after he heard someone call the Clinch the Tirehole River, a joking comparison to Wyoming's Firehole River. "I was mortified, and that was the genesis of the cleanups." Sponsors of this year's cleanup included Anderson County Solid Waste, area ham radio operators, Holm Construction, Bingham Tire of Clinton, Keep Anderson County Beautiful, Museum of Appalachia, Steve and Kathy Stout, Tennessee Valley Authority and Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency. Clinch River Chapter TU works to preserve and protect the Clinch River tailwater and its watershed through conservation projects and through education of children and adults in aquatic natural resources. Meetings are held the second Thursday of the month at St. Francis Episcopal Church, Norris, except when outdoor activities are scheduled. For more information, visit http://crctu.org/.


