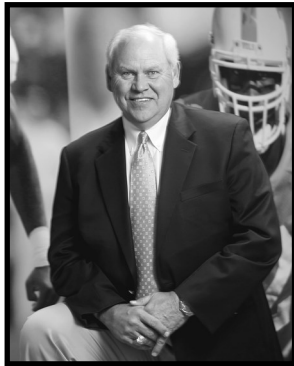
## Annual Dinner

Rocky Top, TN-The Coal Creek Miners Museum celebrated their Grand Opening on March 11, 2016. The museum is located at 201 South Main Street, Rocky Top, TN. The museum not only tells the story of the miners that lived, worked and died in Coal Creek, Fraterville and Briceville Tennessee, it also tells about the historically significant events that changed the mining industry.



The story starts in the late 1800s when the "free" miners fought against the convict lease system, a struggle that ultimately ended the system in the southern states. The story goes on to depict how these communities not only survived one mining disaster, but two that killed almost every man in the community along with many young boys.

The museum was originally founded as part of the Tennessee Homecoming '86 Celebration, a year-long recognition of Tennessee's history that encouraged local communities to celebrate their history. The museum has been moved to several different locations throughout the years. Its artifacts were most recently housed in a room in the city's community center.

In August 2013, the Anderson County Commission voted to donate funds to the City of Lake City, TN, now known as Rocky Top, TN to purchase a former bank building and transform it into a museum.

While seeking grant money to remodel the entire building, the Coal Creek Miners Museum Board of Directors and volunteers from the community started a grass roots effort to remodel the first floor and open phase one of the museum.

"All of the labor and funds to purchase supplies have been donated from the board members and the community," said Isbel. "It has been wonderful to see how the community has supported this project."

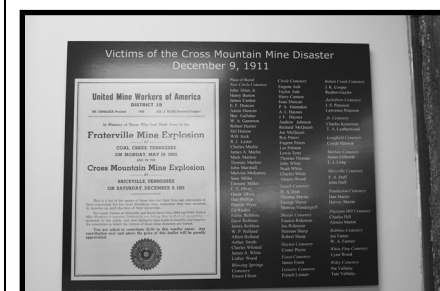
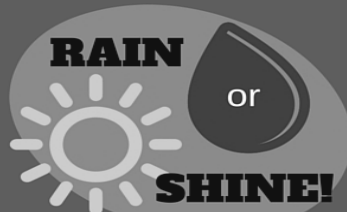

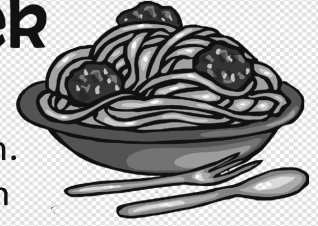

## Book Discussion

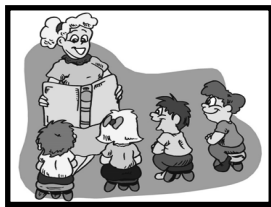

## Knoxville/Clinton/Oak Ridge Prepare to Host Events to Honor Legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen

America's tribute to the Tuskegee Airmen, and their *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* mobile theater to town for family-friendly activities in April. The events are a unique way to experience the inspiring story of the Tuskegee Airmen – America's first black military pilots and their support personnel.



The exciting *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* is a fully functional movie theater featuring the original short film "Rise Above," designed to take the audience on a journey through time – and then through the air. The theater's dynamic 160-degree panoramic screen creates the sensation of being in the cockpit soaring above the clouds in the P-51C Mustang, the signature aircraft of the Tuskegee Airmen in WWII. It's much more than a history lesson; the Tuskegee Airmen's ability to triumph over adversity serves as a means to inspire others to RISE ABOVE obstacles in their own lives and achieve their goals.

**April 16-17** the *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit*, along with the CAF Dixie Wing's P-51D Mustang "Red Nose", will be appearing at the [Smoky Mountain Air Show](#). General admission to the air show and entrance to the mobile theater is FREE! Experience the theater then see this majestic vintage fighter up close and personal on static display. Original Tuskegee Airman and pilot George Hardy will be at the *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* to sign autographs and answer questions. Bring the family to meet a living legend!

**April 19-20** the *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* will arrive at the [Green McAdoo Cultural Center](#) and Museum, the site of the first court ordered school desegregation in the South, located at 101 School Street in Clinton where admission is FREE! Hours for the general public are 2:00p.m. til 5:00p.m.

**April 22-23** the American [Museum of Science & Energy](#) will host the *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* at 300 S. Tulane in Oak Ridge. Standard admission rates to the museum apply, although entrance to the mobile theater is FREE.

## About the CAF Red Tail Squadron

The CAF Red Tail Squadron is a volunteer-driven non-profit organization dedicated to educating audiences across the country about the history and legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen, America's first black military pilots and their support personnel. RISE ABOVE Red Tail, their three-fold outreach program, includes a fully restored WWII-era P-51C Mustang, the signature aircraft of the Tuskegee Airmen; the *RISE ABOVE Traveling Exhibit* 53' mobile theater featuring the original panoramic film "Rise Above".

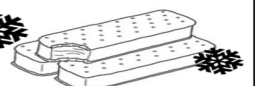

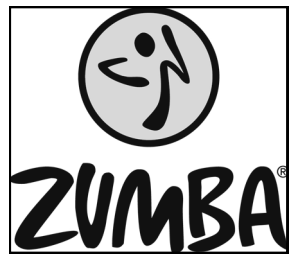

## National Public Safety Telecommunications Week (April 10-16<sup>th</sup>, 2016)

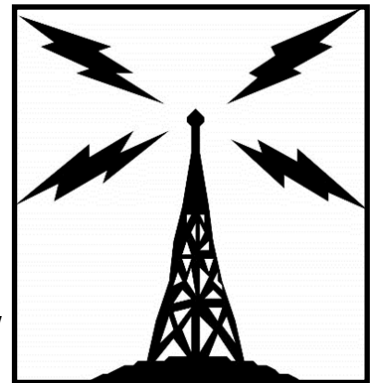
Each year, the second week of April is dedicated to the men and women who serve as public safety telecommunicators.

The City of Rocky Top Police Department Dispatch Center is located inside the Rocky Top Police Department and is currently staffed with three (3) full-time dispatchers and one (1) part time dispatcher. Dispatchers are required to have training and receive proper certification to handle emergency and non-emergency calls. All dispatchers within our department are certified through APCO International and all have received proper certification.

Within the past two (2) years, our dispatch center has received several upgrades to our computer and radio systems including GIS Mapping System Upgrades, computers, NG 911 controller, new radio console, new generator and battery backup, and the latest in 9-1-1 telephone equipment.

Rocky Top Police Department Dispatch Center is part of the Anderson County Emergency Communications District of Anderson County, Tennessee. This district serves the citizens of Anderson County with the exception of Clinton City and City of Oak Ridge. Anderson County 911 District is overseen by a Board of Directors in which Rocky Top Police Chief, James Shetterly, has been a member of the board since 1992 and currently serves as Vice Chairman of the Board.

The Emergency Communications District has operated a dispatch center for approximately 26 years, and will be celebrating their 15 year anniversary of their consolidation with Police, Fire, Rescue Squad, and EMS in Anderson County on April 11<sup>th</sup>.



E911 Director, Regina Copeland, who has been with the district for 17 years advised us that the first 911 call received at the new consolidated dispatch center was to report a cow in the road in the Dutch Valley area of Anderson County.

National Public Safety Telecommunications Week is a week that should be set aside to celebrate those who dedicate their lives to public safety. We hope the citizens of Anderson County join us and other departments in celebrating and recognize dispatchers from our department as well as Anderson County Sheriff's Department, Norris Public Safety, and Oliver Springs Police Department, Clinton Police Department, and Oak Ridge Police Department for all of their dedication and accomplishments.

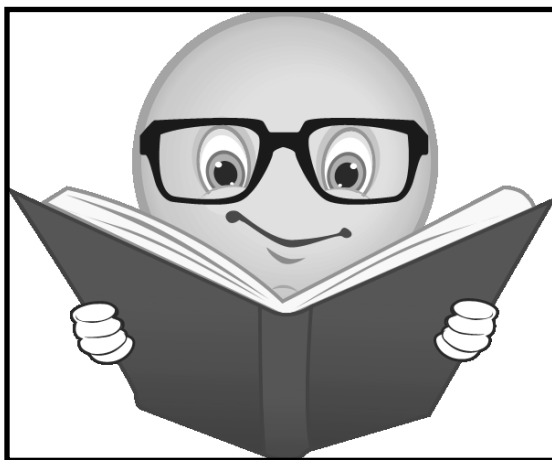
