



The Norris Lake Project Team is looking for volunteers to help with the 11th Annual Fall Five County Norris Lake Cleanup in Anderson, Campbell, Claiborne, Union and Grainger Counties. The Norris Lake Project Team will be working on Saturday, September 18, 2021 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. from Blue Mud Public Boat Launch at Big Ridge State Park and from Indian Mountain Marina.

There will be boats available to shuttle volunteers to and from the cleanup sites that are not accessible by land and barges will be used to transfer the trash back to the shore. However, volunteers are welcome to bring their own boats. All volunteers are encouraged to wear appropriate shoes, preferably boots and bring gloves and a life jacket.
