
14th Annual Pickin' in the Park at Norris Dam State Park

One of my concerns is to see businesses grow in the downtown area again. The recent news that we received a




federal grant to improve the downtown area is great for our city. The City Council and the City Manager are working hard to achieve this future growth.

Best Places to View Fall Colors

It's getting close to that time of year when the days get shorter and the temperatures cool down. With this new season upon us, we are surrounded by some of the most stunning colors and views in the country. Check out these top rated places to view the fall colors:

Clingman's Dome is situated at 6,643 feet above sea

level making it the highest point in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. It is the highest point in Tennessee and the third highest mountain east of the Mississippi, so it's no surprise that it tops many lists for a great place to view fall colors.

The observation tower on the summit of Clingman's Dome

offers spectacular 360 degree views of the Smoky Mountains and an unparalleled view of the vibrant colors. Keep in mind, you need to be willing to climb the steep half-mile walk to the tower.

Cumberland Gap National Historical Park lies along the borders of Tennessee, Kentucky and Virginia. The Pinnacle Overlook located within the park has views of the Cumberland Gap, a pass in the Cumberland Mountains once used by pioneers heading west.

From the visitor center, drive the winding four mile long Skyland Road up to the Pinnacle Overlook, elevation 2,440 feet for a spectacular view of the beautiful fall colors.

The Cherohala Skyway is a 43 mile National Scenic Byway that connects Tellico Plains, Tennessee to

Robbinsville, North Carolina. The road crosses through the Cherokee and Nantahala National Forests thus the name "Chero...hala".

The skyway offers sweeping mountain views as far as the eyes can see and unobstructed scenic overlooks around every corner.

House Mountain is a 527-acre natural area located in Corryton and is Knox County's highest peak. The hike to the 2,100 foot crest of House Mountain provides significant vistas to view the Unaka and Cumberland Mountain ranges some 30 miles away.

When fall colors arrive, the area is full of a beautiful, autumn

display. Directions: Take I-40 east to Rutledge Pike, exit #392, and turn right off the exit. Travel 10 miles then turn left on Idumea Rd. Turn left on Hogskin Rd and travel less than a mile and the park will be on the right.

The Hatfield Knob Elk Viewing Tower at the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area in Campbell County is not your typical location to view fall colors, but it provides a beautiful view and wildlife, so it's a win in our book.

A ribbon cutting was recently held to unveil a new tower where visitors can relax, take in the view and watch the wildlife pass by. October is usually the best time to see and hear the bugling of elk during their rut and it's also the perfect time to enjoy the stunning fall colors.



Halloween Safety Month

Everyone loves a good scare on Halloween, but not when it comes to the safety of our children. There are many things parents and kids can do to stay safe on Halloween. Here are a few:

- -Make sure all costumes, wigs and accessories are fire-resistant.
- -Use reflective tape on costumes and/or bags.
- -Carry glow sticks and/ or flashlights when it is dark.
- -Choose make-up over masks, just be sure it is non-toxic. Masks can obscure vision.
- -When trick or treating, only go to homes with the porch light on.
- -Never enter a home or car for a treat.
- -Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home, and take care to avoid any food allergies.
- -Remind children to stay in groups and don't wander off alone.
- -Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- -Put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- -Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.

Fall Color Boat Tours at Norris Dam State Park

Each year nature displays a spectacular array of fall colors and Norris Dam State Park is one of the premier places to view them. Join Norris Dam State Park for a pontoon boat ride and view the beautiful display of nature's artistry. Starting October 13th through October 30th at 12:30 p.m. & 2:00 p.m. daily, park staff will offer guided pontoon boat tours on beautiful Norris Lake.

Registration is required and is limited to only

10 people per trip. These trips are \$15.00 per adult (6 years and over) and \$10.00 per child (5 years and under). Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. If you plan on bringing a child, please bring a life jacket for them.



Each boat ride will last approximately one hour and will depart from Norris Dam Marina. To sign up for a trip please call the park office at 865-425-4500 ext. 0 or for more information visit https://tnstateparks.com/parks/norris-dam under "Upcoming Events." Trips will be weather dependent.

These tours are a highlight event for many park visitors every year. While on the tour a park ranger will narrate by discussing the decades of history relevant to the area, as well as identifying and viewing flora and fauna that you might encounter.

Most fall seasons, many bald eagles can be seen flying over the lake or perched atop a branch waiting for their next move. The fall color tours offered by the park are an excellent time to view these wondrous creatures.

National Chili Month

October is National Chili Month and the perfect time to get out those slow cookers, Dutch ovens or your favorite soup pot and try a new chili recipe.

Cha Cha's White Chicken Chili

Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 (4 oz) can diced jalapeno peppers
- 1 (4 oz) can chopped green chile peppers
- 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon ground cayenne pepper
- 2 (14.5 oz) cans chicken broth
- 3 cups chopped cooked chicken breast
- 3 (15 oz) cans white beans
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese

Directions:

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium-low heat. Slowly cook and stir the onion until tender. Mix in the garlic, jalapenos, green chile peppers, cumin, oregano and cavenne. Continue to cook and stir the mixture until tender, about 3 minutes. Mix in the chicken broth, chicken and white beans. Simmer 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Remove from heat and slowly stir in the cheese until melted. Serve with tortilla chips or cornbread.
