# **Hometown Christmas Story**

If you've been a resident of Rocky Top for some time, you've probably heard about Christmas food baskets and more recently, food vouchers, that are

given to those in need around the holidays. What you may not have heard is how the baskets and vouchers got started.



It all began in the late 1940s when longtime resident, Jim Ed Lawson, and several other men saw a need in the community. They began what is called the "Jim Ed Lawson/JW Prewitt Memorial Christmas Basket Fund". J.W. (Bill) Prewitt, having worked with the program for more than 50 years, was the chairman of the Christmas Basket Fund Committee until 2013, when his son, Marvin Prewitt took on the role.

In the early years of the program, Shop Rite (formerly Piggly Wiggly), sold groceries to the program at cost. The Masonic Lodge Hall in Rocky Top would open their building up and volunteers would come together to fill food baskets with flour, sugar, potatoes, canned ham, fruit and more. The baskets were then handed out on the morning of Christmas Eve.

# Free Medical Clinic Receives Grant Award

U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development announced that it is awarding \$74

million in grants to improve health care facilities in rural towns across the Nation.

USDA Rural Development promotes a healthy community and environment through the Emergency Rural



Health Care Grants to make sure people, kids and families have access to the health care they need.

The grants support the ability of rural communities to provide health care to the people and places in our country that often lack access.

Out of that money, Free Medical Clinic of Oak Ridge Inc. will use an \$804,600 grant to continue the vital primary care needed in Briceville and Harriman. The project will assist to mitigate COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and death for lowincome residents served by the clinic.

The investment will also help purchase two vehicles that will expand testing and vaccination outreach programs and provide the backbone to the clinic's new "Community Healthcare Initiative."

The project will benefit approximately 8,000 residents near the clinics in Briceville and Harriman.



### App Available for Students to Anonymously Report Concerns

ASAP of Anderson continues to encourage Anderson County and Oak Ridge students to use the P3 Campus app. Students can use the software to anonymously report mental health needs, guns, suicide threats, violence, drugs, vandalism, bullying, or they can reach out if they just need someone to talk to. Professionals will respond to any concerns communicated through the platform, and someone will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to respond to incoming messages.

P3 Campus allows ASAP to foster a relationship between school officials, police officers, mental health professionals, parents and caregivers, and students themselves.

Students themselves. Students from Anderson County and Oak Ridge High Schools can send concerns through the P3 Campus app on their phone or on their computer by visiting P3Campus.com.



Reports made through the P3 Campus app have no limit on how long the message can be. Reporters can send pictures, screenshots, videos, or audio recordings on the website or app, and they can talk to a real person who will quickly respond to their messages. ASAP of Anderson is confident that P3 Campus will benefit students and school administrators by bringing awareness to substance misuse and mental health needs.

Today, instead of food baskets being given out, Food City vouchers are given to those in need. The vouchers will be given out around the second Saturday in December, just in time to purchase a Christmas meal.

Donations for the program come from local businesses, community members, area churches and events. Without these gracious donations, the program would not be possible.

We also have to mention one Rocky Top community member that has worked hard over the years to make the program a success and that is Vicki Massey. Vicki works tirelessly to make sure the Christmas Basket program is available to those in need, as well as Angel Tree gifts for the children in Rocky Top.



## 2022 ROCKY TOP PARADE INFORMATION

The Rocky Top Christmas Parade will be on Friday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7 p.m. The theme for this year's parade is "A Storybook Christmas".

Participants are encouraged to decorate their floats in accordance with the theme.

In person registration will start at 5:00 p.m. on December 2<sup>nd</sup> and everyone must be registered by 6:45 p.m. so that all participants can get in line for the parade.

# Everyone that participates in the parade must register and sign a release form.

NEW THIS YEAR, you can register early online at <u>www.RockyTopTNChamber.com</u>. Click on Christmas Parade and fill out the registration from.

If you register online, you will still need to check in during the registration time on December 2<sup>nd</sup> in order to get your number.

If you are participating in the parade with a float or a group, please only send one person to check-in during registration. If you prefer to fill out a paper copy of the registration form, you can also find those online. Please feel free to copy the form so that all participants can complete a form.

If you are driving a classic or antique car or an all-terrain vehicle in the parade, you will need to park and register/check-in at Rocky Top Dentistry located at 110 Industrial Park Road. Please back your car into one of the spaces provided while you are waiting for the parade to start.

If you are riding an all-terrain vehicle in the parade you MUST be 16 years or older and have a valid Driver's License, you MUST wear a helmet and you MUST show proof of Liability Insurance at Registration.

Emergency vehicles will line up on Industrial Park Road. Industrial Park Road to Hustler Boat Lane will be closed at 5 p.m. until all parade participants leave the area.

Anyone participating with a horse will register at Lake City Middle School. All horses must wear a horse diaper or you will not be eligible to participate in the parade. If you are sponsoring a float or a group, you must also register at Lake City Middle School. All floats and everyone participating with floats must be lined up **behind** the Middle School. **Please DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE PARKED BEHIND THE SCHOOL while you participate in the parade.** The gates will be locked when the last float leaves and you will not be able to pick up your car until Monday morning when school resumes.

If you are sponsoring a group or float, please designate a place and time for your group to meet at Lake City Middle School. The volunteers assisting with registration will not be responsible for watching children dropped off by their parents. The group sponsor is responsible for submitting all completed registration/release forms and ensuring that participants under 18 years old, have a completed form signed by the child's guardian and ensuring that all participants are aware of the rules regarding the parade. If you are sponsoring a group or float, please encourage your participants to register online in advance by filling out the online form or printing and completing the PDF paper version.

Please be aware that you will not be able to participate in the parade if you are not registered and have received a number. Numbers will need to be placed on the front or driver's side of the vehicle.

Prizes and Awards will be given out at the City Council Meeting on Dec. 15<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Float and Top Three Cars/ Trucks categories and 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Group category and there will be awards for 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Tractor and ATV/UTV categories.

We also want to let you know that Santa Clause has been contacted and he plans to attend the parade. He would appreciate it if no one else dresses up like him so that the children won't be confused.

# **Thanksgiving Recipe**

Have you ever wondered why pumpkin pie was a Thanksgiving tradition? As it turns out, pumpkin pie is about as American as Thanksgiving itself. The colonists and indigenous people ate pumpkins and squash frequently in the 1600s, so gourds were most likely served at the first Thanksgiving. Since most people already have a favorite pumpkin pie recipe, we thought we'd share a recipe that gives a twist to the traditional pumpkin pie.

Paula Dean's Pumpkin Pie Cheesecake Ingredients:

- 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups graham cracker crumbs
- 3 tablespoons light brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 stick salted butter, melted
- 3 (8-ounce) packages at room temperature cream cheese
- 1 (15-ounce) can pureed pumpkin
- 4 eggs (3 eggs plus 1 yolk)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup sour cream
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups sugar
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon fresh ground nutmeg
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Directions:
  - Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
  - Crust In a medium bowl, combine crumbs, sugar and ½ teaspoon cinnamon. Add melted butter. Press down flat into a 9 inch spring form pan. Set aside.
  - Filling Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add pumpkin puree, eggs, egg yolk, sour cream, sugar and the spices. Add four and vanilla. Beat together until well combined.
  - Pour into crust/ Spread out evenly and place in oven for 1 hour. Remove from the oven and let sit for 15 minutes. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 4 hours.
