Each year the chamber awards a local business and a community member an award for their dedication





## Main Street Baptist Church Sends Two Mission Teams to Guatemala

On January 4-14 a team of 4 medical professionals joined Crossville Medical Mission to travel to and serve the Chorti Mayan people of Eastern Guatemala.

The team of 14 stayed at Servant Ministries Center in Camotan and traveled from there to

different mountain villages holding five free Medical and Dental clinics. Nearly

1400 patients were treated

by physicians/ dentists,

nurses and received medications, vitamins and parasite treatments.

On February 9 - 19, a second team will traveled to Servant Ministries in Camotan, Guatemala to distribute donated school supplies to approximately 35 mountain schools, build 2 Samaritan project homes, and to hold a women's conference for the people of the villages.

The team spent an afternoon at a school that MSBC has sponsored to bless the students with food bundles, gifts, teaching supplies and taking school pictures for each student.

#### Youth Ambassador Coalition Students Meet Lt. Gov. McNally in Nashville

Students involved in ASAP of Anderson's Youth Ambassador Coalition (YAC) recently traveled to Nashville to speak with legislators about drug prevention.

YAC is a group of students from Anderson County, Clinton, and Oak Ridge High Schools who work diligently to prevent and reduce substance misuse in their community.

ASAP of Anderson also partnered with Metro Drug Coalition in Knoxville to take high schoolers from across the county to meet with Representative Ragan and Lt. Gov. McNally.

While in Nashville, students advocated for adding restrictions to Delta-8 - Ambassadors advocated for restrictions on Delta-8, including banning cartoon characters on packaging and



requiring a 21 and up age restriction for Delta-8. They also advocated for funding for opioid alternatives. Ambassadors educated legislators about

the benefits of alternatives to opioids for Medicare patients, including chiropractic care, massage therapy, physical therapy, and local anesthetics.

Lastly, they advocated for more prevention education in schools. Ambassadors spoke with Ragan and Lt. Gov. McNally about implementing more education about substance misuse prevention in local schools.

Currently, ASAP provides free education about alcohol, stimulant, marijuana, and nicotine prevention in all three high schools in Anderson County.

In January, YAC members traveled to Washington, D.C. to engage with federal legislators. They educated Congressman Fleischmann, Senator Blackburn, and Senator Hagerty about the proposed Delta-8 restrictions, swapping out opioids for safer alternatives for Medicare patients, and prevention education.

"BUG CAMP 2023" is back for the first time since 2019! Open to rising third to fifth grade students, the camp will be held at the UT Arboretum in Oak Ridge.

The students will explore the good, the bad and the "buggly" of our relationship with the insect world. Through creative methods like bug crafts, nature walks, science activities and the UT Insect Zoo, the students will learn why the world can't live without insects. Each participant will have an opportunity to take home and "host" an insect if they choose during the camp session.

# Day Trip Adventures from Rocky Top

**March 2023** 

Spring break is almost here and it's the perfect time to plan a day trip. Luckily, Rocky Top is a stone's throw from some great places to visit. Here are 3 places that would make a fun day trip for all ages:

Ruby Falls - Many of us have heard of Ruby Falls, but aren't quite sure what it is or even where it is.

Ruby Falls is located on Lookout Mountain in Chattanooga, a quick two hour drive from Rocky

Top. Ruby Falls is home to the tallest and deepest underground waterfall open to the public in the United States.

Descend 260 feet by glass -front elevator to explore the scenic path to the breathtaking waterfall deep within Lookout Mountain led by a Ruby Falls guide.

See stalagmites, stalactites, drapery formations and flowstone plus learn

about the cave's storied history. Take in sweeping views of the Tennessee Valley and Tennessee River from historic Lookout Mountain Tower, Blue Heron Overlook, and the Ruby Falls Village Plaza.

Extend the visit to include High Point ZIP Adventure at Ruby Falls, featuring zip lines and climbing tower surrounded by spectacular vistas. Visitors should plan to spend 2-3 hours at Ruby Falls and please note, tickets must be purchased online. No walk up tickets will be sold.

The Arc Encounter is about a three hour drive from Rocky Top, but highly worth the trip. Experience Bible history come to life at the life-size Noah's Ark!

The Ark was built according to the dimensions given in the Bible, spanning 510 feet long, 85 feet wide and 51 feet high.

It is the largest timber-frame structure in the



world, built in part by skilled Amish craftsmen from standing dead timber. It is truly an engineering marvel.

As you enter Noah's world on the Ark, you'll tour three decks filled with world-class exhibits that will allow you to experience what Noah's life may have been like, from cooking to sleeping, recreation and even gardening.

You will encounter a host of life-like sculpted animals and learn how Noah could have cared for

them.

The Ark Encounter also features a zoo, zip lines and a restaurant. Keep in mind these charge additional admission fees.

Kids 10 and under receive free admission to the Ark in 2022.

If you've lived in East Tennessee long enough, you've most likely been to Gatlinburg more times than you can count, but don't

count out the Gatlinburg Skylift Park as a great day trip option.

It gives you access to some of the best views of the Smoky Mountains and plenty of adventure is available for the adrenaline junkies.

Ride the Skylift chairs from the heart of downtown Gatlinburg up 1,800 feet to the SkyBridge which happens to be the longest pedestrian cable bridge in North America.

The bridge sits 500 feet above Gatlinburg with 30 feet of glass in the center, so it's not for the faint of heart.

You also have the SkyDeck with expansive views of the beautiful Smoky Mountains and you can enjoy a delicious lunch at the SkyCenter.

The SkyTrail is new to the park this year and is a scenic walkway connecting both ends of the SkyBridge.

# Tennessee Tree Day March 18, 2023

Every year in the state of Tennessee, hundreds of native tree species are destroyed due to human development and natural disasters. Native trees are important members of our communities providing homes and habitats for fellow wildlife and pollinators, increasing property value and cooling and cleaning our atmospheres.

Since 2007, the Tennessee Tree Program and its many volunteers have been trailblazers in helping reforest Tennessee by facilitating the planting of 822,860 native trees across Tennessee and beyond.

Be an active member in creating greater change by helping reforest Tennessee.

#### Step by Step Planting Guide for Bare Root Seedlings

- Unpack remove any packing materials carefully, and then gently untangle the roots. It is very important not to let the roots dry out. We recommend letting them soak in water for 2-4 hours prior to planting.
- 2. Dig a hole approximately one foot in diameter. Roots need enough space to grow outward.
- 3. Make a small mound of soil in the bottom of the hole.
- 4. Take the seedling and flare the roots out in all directions
- 5.Cover roots with loose soil. Lightly tamp soil down. It should be firmly but not tightly packed.
- 6. Water the tree thoroughly after planting. Add 3-5 gallons of water. Do not compact the soil by tamping wet soil. Soil compaction eliminates oxygen, which roots need to survive!
- 7. After the water has soaked in, spread protective mulch 2 inches deep in a 2-3 foot diameter area around the base of the tree, but not touching the trunk.
- 8. Continue watering every 2-3 days for a few weeks and then just once a week, (a) 3-5 gallons for a few months. This will help establish the root system.
