

and installation of propane tanks and appliances," says Scott Daugherty, owner of TN GAS.

The TN Gas team installs and services propane tanks at the client's desired location. It actively monitors the contents of each customer's propane tank through a remotely-controlled system in realtime. This prevents deadhead runs as staff can refill the exact amount of propane required by checking the readings on their digital tracking system.

The team also uses these readings to schedule a client's refueling appointment. TN GAS has a readily available inventory of propane cylinder fills for RVs, welding supplies and welding rods, and



grill tanks at its physical outlet. Clients can avoid delays in resupply by keeping the team informed of their commonly used products, and it takes

special care to keep the items in stock.

Situated in the rural town of Rocky Top in East Tennessee, TN GAS accounts for the challenges its financially-challenged customers might face in affording bills for remote readings when creating its service plans. This is in adherence to its philosophy of viewing them as human beings rather than utility account numbers.

To ensure an uninterrupted fuel supply to these customers, TN GAS offers a "worry-free" plan. Clients receive a remote that updates its systems with real-time information on their propane tank's contents. Where other companies would typically charge for tank readings, TN GAS gives it free-ofcharge.

Aside from propane and welding supplies, TN GAS offers CO2 systems for commercial and industrial clients that come with a simple exchange system. Clients receive two cylinders at the beginning; when one runs empty, they only need to flip a switch to use the other one.


