Tennessee's Grocery Sales Tax Holiday

As Tennesseans, we are all too familiar with the burden of high sales taxes on our daily purchases. However, a glimmer of hope is on the horizon as August 1, 2023, marks the beginning of a sales tax holiday that will bring some much-needed relief to grocery shoppers across the state.

For a period of three months, until October 31, 2023, Tennesseans can purchase food and food ingredients tax-free.



This tax-free opportunity is a significant development for residents who have long grappled with the heavy tax burden.

While many states across the nation exempt grocery purchases from their sales tax, Tennessee has continued to impose a 4% state levy on all food purchases, contributing to an average combined state and local tax rate of 9.548%.

According to a study conducted by the Tax Foundation, Tennessee's tax rate is second only to Louisiana's 9.55% average.

The sales tax holiday allows us to take advantage of this limited-time opportunity and stock


PCUD Honored with Gold Level SOAR Award


Powell Clinch Utility District has been honored with the prestigious Gold Level SOAR Award by the American Public Gas Association (APGA).



Rocky Top's Spectacular Fourth of July Event


