#### **ASAP of Anderson Offers FREE Opioid Overdose Trainings**

Individuals and agencies can receive life-saving education through ASAP of Anderson.

According to data from the Knox County Medical Examiner, the opioid overdose death rate in Anderson County has decreased 67% between 2022 and 2021. While this statistic is an optimistic one for the county, we also recognize that there is still work to be done.

Naloxone, brand name Narcan, is a proven tool in the ongoing battle against fatal opioid overdoses. Naloxone can reverse a potentially fatal situation by allowing a person to temporarily breathe again for a period of 30 to 90 minutes following an opioid overdose.

Naloxone is not a "cure" but is only intended to provide time for emergency medical services to arrive which is why it is always important to call 911 when treating an overdose.

ASAP of Anderson offers Tennessee Save a Life training which is conducted by a Regional Overdose Prevention Specialist (ROPS) and teaches the science of addiction and overdose, how to recognize an opioid overdose, and how to administer an opioid overdose reversal drug such as naloxone.

Any individual or organization can request a FREE training by visiting www.asapofanderson.org/ initiatives/naloxone/ and completing a brief online registration form.

Drug overdoses are preventable, which is why community members are specifically encouraged to schedule a TN Save a Life Training. ASAP regularly partners with individuals, police departments, fire departments, places of worship, businesses, and other entities to deliver this education and provide information on how to obtain naloxone kits to help save lives.

#### ROCKY TOP PARADE INFORMATION

The parade will be on Friday, December 1st at 7 p.m. The theme for this year's parade is "Christmas in Toyland". Participants are encouraged to decorate their floats in accordance with the theme.

There is not a fee to participate in the parade, but you must register online or in person. In lieu of a registration fee, participants are asked to donate a toy to benefit the kids of Rocky Top. You can drop off toys at the registration tables or at city hall.

You can register online at www.RockyTopTN Chamber.com. If you register online, you will still need to check in during the registration time on December 1st in order to get your number.

In person registration will start at 5:00 p.m. on December 1st and everyone must be registered by 6:45 p.m.

If you prefer to fill out a paper copy of the registration form, you can also find those online or email RockyTopChamber@gmail.com to receive a copy.

If you are driving a classic or antique car or an allterrain vehicle in the parade, you will need to park and register/check-in at Rocky Top Dentistry located at 110 Industrial Park Road.

If you are riding an all-terrain vehicle in the parade you MUST be 16 years or older and have a valid Driver's License. You MUST also wear a helmet.

Emergency vehicles will line up on Industrial Park Road. Industrial Park Road to Hustler Boat Lane will be closed at 5 p.m. until all parade participants leave the area.

Anyone participating with a horse will register at Lake City Middle School. All horses must wear a horse diaper or you will not be eligible to participate in the parade.

If you are sponsoring a float or a group, you must also register at Lake City Middle School. All floats and everyone participating with floats must be lined up behind the Middle School. Please DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE PARKED BEHIND THE SCHOOL

while you participate in the parade. The gates will be locked when the last float leaves and you will not be able to pick up your car until Monday morning when school resumes.

If you are sponsoring a group or float, please designate a place and time for your group to meet at Lake City Middle School. The volunteers assisting with registration will not be responsible for watching children dropped off by their parents. The group sponsor is responsible for submitting all completed registration/release forms and ensuring that participants under 18 years old, have a completed form signed by the child's guardian and ensuring that all participants are aware of the rules regarding the parade. If you are sponsoring a group or float, please encourage your participants to register online in advance by filling out the online form or printing and completing the PDF paper version.

PLEASE BE AWARE THAT YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PARADE IF YOU ARE NOT REGISTERED AND HAVE SIGNED THE RELEASE FORM. IF YOU DO NOT REGISTER AND HAVE A NUMBER YOU WILL NOT BE IN THE PARADE. NUMBERS NEED TO BE PLACED ON FRONT OR DRIVER'S SIDE OF ALL VEHICLES.

Prizes and Awards will be given out at the City Council Meeting on December 21st at 5:30 p.m. for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the Float and Top Three Cars/Trucks categories and 1st and 2nd place in the Group category and there will be awards for 1st place in the Tractor and ATV/UTV categories.

New this year – there will be a People's Choice Award given by the City – Voting will take place on the City's Facebook page.

We also want to let you know that Santa Clause has been contacted and he plans to attend the parade. He would appreciate it if no one else dresses up like him so that the children won't be confused.
