P3 Campus App Available for Students to Anonymously **Report Safety or Mental Health Concerns**

ASAP of Anderson continues to encourage Oak Ridge and Anderson County students to use the P3 Campus app. Students are able to use this software to anonymously report numerous needs and concerns from mental health needs, gun violence, bullying, substance misuse or even if they just need someone to talk to.

Professionals trained to work with students will respond to any concerns communicated and someone will be available at all times.

P3 Campus has a 3 tiered system in which they work with the students and the administrators to COMMUNICATE.

COLLABORATE, and hold everyone ACCOUNTABLE. This system allows students to feel heard, even when they are not

comfortable discussing them with some they know. In 81% of incidents in US schools, someone else besides the perpetrator knew it was happening but failed to report it. This software allows 81% to

become 0% by working with students to solve their

issues.

P3 Campus allows ASAP to continue to foster a relationship between school officials, police officers, mental health professionals, parents and caregivers, and students themselves.

Students from Oak Ridge and Anderson County High Schools can send concerns through the P3

> Campus app on their phone or on their computer by visiting P3Campus.com. The Oak Ridge School System has the app downloaded onto every school laptop for seamless access for students. Reports can be as detailed as the student wants, with the capability to send media (pictures, audio recordings, etc.), and they can talk to a real person who will quickly respond to their messages.

P3 Campus has been beneficial to our students in the past and we are confident that it will continue to serve

the students, parents, and teachers of Anderson County.

5th Year in a Row with No Audit Findings for Circuit Court Clerk

Anderson County Circuit Court Clerk, Rex Lynch, announces that for the fifth year in a row, there are no audit findings for his offices.

Auditors from the Tennessee Comptroller's Office perform the audits for Anderson County Government

including the offices of Circuit, General Sessions and Juvenile Court Clerks.

The Circuit Court Clerk is responsible for filing and maintaining the legal paperwork presented by attorneys, law enforcement and pro se litigants for each of these courts, as well

as the collection of fees and fines. The offices combined file on average, over fifteen thousand (15,000) cases per year.

Auditors review records and processes with the office of Circuit Court Clerk, including software integrity, receipting and record keeping practices for the \$4 million collected annually on average.

Prior to September 2018, the previous Circuit Court Clerk was responsible for at least fifty percent (50%) of all findings for Anderson County Government.

"After being elected in 2018, one of my goals was to eliminate audit findings in the offices for which I am responsible," said Lynch. "I take audit findings very seriously and have worked with my staff to eliminate them."



Lynch praised his staff for the diligent work keeping software and finances in order. The following staff members were presented a Certificate of Appreciation for working with auditors and keeping all the financial records in order - Angela Metcalf, Bookkeeper; Ashley

Brock, Officer Manager for Circuit and Criminal Court Clerks; Amanda Vowell, Office Manager for General Sessions Court Division I Clerks; Shalea Prickett, Office Manager for General Sessions Court Division II Clerks; Barbara Grom, Office Manager for Juvenile Court Clerks; Maura Vespie, Collections Manager; and Angie Perez, Chief Deputy Clerk.

"With the procedures and protocols that we have implemented since I took office along with the diligent work of my staff, we should continue to receive excellent audit reports in the future" Lynch added.

Reindeer Food Snack Mix

Ingredients:

- 1 (20 ounce) package miniature pretzels
- 1 (17.5 ounce) package crispy corn cereal squares (such as Corn Chex®)
- 1 (16 ounce) jar salted dry-roasted peanuts
- 1 (14 ounce) package M&M's®
- 24 ounces white chocolate, chopped

Directions:

Cover a large area of counter space with waxed paper. Mix pretzels, corn cereal, peanuts and M&M's in a large bowl. Melt white chocolate. 


