Museum Awarded a Capitol Maintenance and Improvement Grant

The Coal Creek Miners Museum is a recipient of a \$50,000 grant for Capital Maintenance and Improvement from the State of Tennessee as administered through the Tennessee State Museum.

The grant award will be used for HVAC and ADA-compliant restroom repairs on the second floor

of the museum.

The
Tennessee
General
Assembly
made available
\$5 million in
funding from



the 2023-2024 Appropriations Act, "for the sole purpose of providing grants to museums with a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization or affiliated with a governmental entity for capital maintenance and improvements."

It was a highly competitive process. In total, the Tennessee State Museum received 170 applications, totaling \$12.5M in funding requests for the \$5M appropriation.

The Museum made full or partial awards to 108 museums across the state, representing 58

County Awarded Tourism Enhancement Grant

The Tennessee Department of Tourist Development has granted Anderson County \$100,000 as part of the Tourism Enhancement Grants, bringing the total awarded to 29 communities to over \$2.22 million.

In collaboration with the Anderson County
Tourism Council and the Anderson County
Conservation Board, the grant will pave the parking
area near the public boat launch at Anderson
County Park on Norris Lake.

This marks the third enhancement grant for Anderson County Park, following successful projects that expanded the public ramp and added camping spots.



The initiative addresses increased demand from boaters and aims to attract larger fishing tournaments, enhancing

the region's tourism appeal.

The county is matching the grant with an additional \$100,000 from the tourism fund.

ASAP Staff Travel to Washington

ASAP had the chance to travel to Washington D.C. to learn about drug prevention best practices and speak with legislators on drug prevention advocacy.

The staff learned about strengthening ASAP Initiatives. The staff also attended learning sessions

focused on safe alcohol and drug usage, along with the importance of mental health.

The staff spoke with Congressman Fleischmann, Senator Blackburn's aides,



and Senator Hagerty's aides about the importance of implementing strong drug prevention policies within our community.

Currently, ASAP provides free education about alcohol, stimulants, marijuana, and nicotine prevention in all three high schools in Anderson County.

This experience enabled ASAP staff to become better advocates and community leaders for the people of Anderson County. The material learned at this conference will further be applied to monthly coalition meetings discussions and with their Youth Ambassador Coalition.

Easy Taco Soup

Ingredients:

2 pounds ground beef

1 envelope taco seasoning

1-1/2 cups water

1 can (16 ounces) mild chili beans, undrained

1 can (15-1/4 ounces) whole kernel corn, drained

1 can (15 ounces) pinto beans, rinsed and drained

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) stewed tomatoes

1 can (10 ounces) diced tomato with green chiles

1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chiles, optional

1 envelope ranch salad dressing mix

Directions:

In a Dutch oven, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles; drain. Add taco seasoning and mix well. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, for 15 minutes or until heated through, stirring occasionally.

counties.

"The Tennessee State Museum serves the State of Tennessee through history, art, and culture," said Ashley Howell, Tennessee State Museum Executive Director. "There is incredible work being done throughout the state by our strong network of Tennessee museums and historic homes. This grant is an extension of how we can further support their efforts and the preservation of local and state history. We thank the Tennessee General Assembly for their support for Tennessee Museums."

"The funding that will be provided through this grant will give us a jumpstart on remodeling the second floor of the museum," said Tim Isbel, Chairperson of the Coal Creek Miners Museum. "The HVAC and an ADA-compliant restroom are a very important component in the remodeling project that will expand capacity, allowing us to display a more extensive collection of artifacts and exhibits. This, in turn, enables us to offer a more comprehensive and immersive experience for visitors."

The museum will also be using funds from their memorial brick campaign to complete the other needed renovations.


The Capital Improvement and Maintenance grant had a minimum request amount of \$5,000 and a maximum request amount of \$100,000. All projects must be completed by June 30, 2024.

The Coal Creek Miners Museum serves to preserve, honor, and promote the rich history, culture, and economic heritage of all aspects of coal mining and the unique story of the coal miners in Coal Creek, TN utilizing education and outreach to foster economic and community development.

The museum tells the story of mining in East Tennessee but more specifically the unique story Coal Creek, TN featuring the Coal Creek War, a labor dispute between miners and mine owners revolving around the convict lease system. It also commemorates the Fraterville mine disaster and the Cross Mountain Mine Disaster, two tragic events that rank among the most devastating mine disasters in U.S. history.
