# Sign up for the John Thurman Trout Adventure Camp

Applications are open for the John Thurman Trout Adventure Camp for middle-school-age girls and boys, scheduled June 17-22 in Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

The camp, sponsored by the Tennessee Council of Trout Unlimited (TU) and supported by proceeds from TU's Tennessee Conservation License Plate, is based at the Great Smoky Mountains Institute at Tremont.

The camp is aimed at youth 12–16 years old who are interested in learning conservation through the sport of fly fishing in a mountain stream environment. Campers can be boys or girls (TU does require at least two campers of one gender) and are encouraged to be Tennessee residents.

John Thurman Trout Adventure Camp promotes an appreciation of coldwater conservation through activities in stream science and fly fishing. Campers receive instruction in fly casting, fly tying, how to fish mountain streams, as well as being guided on fishing trips by experienced mentors.

Science activities include catching and identifying aquatic invertebrates and flying bugs that trout eat, learning how they are duplicated with artificial fishing flies, trapping and



identifying fish that live in streams, and observing fish in their natural habitat by snorkeling in a stream. Although activities are planned for every day, there is also time for recreation including swimming, hiking and fishing.

Great Smoky Mountains Institute at Tremont is located along the Middle Prong of Little River in Great Smoky Mountains National Park. The facility includes dining hall, classrooms and sleeping facilities; the institute's professional staff lead some camp activities.

p.m., this event aims to preserve the natural beauty and conserve the resources of the Norris Lake Watershed area.

The cleanup effort will be conducted at three locations including Anderson County Park, Flat Hollow Marina and Hickory Star Marina.

Volunteers will have access to boats that will

transport them to and from cleanup sites inaccessible by land.

Additionally, barges will be utilized to transport collected trash back to the shore.

Volunteers with boats are encouraged to bring them to assist in the efforts.



All volunteers

are asked to wear appropriate footwear, preferably boots. Volunteers can also bring gloves and life jackets if they have them, especially for youth participants.

Minors must be accompanied by an adult and are required to have a registration and release form signed by a parent.

We are looking forward to a Book & Bake Sale in


April hosted by our Friends of the Library group! So get ready for some delicious treats and great deals on books all to benefit the library!

## ASAP Spends a Day on the Hill

ASAP of Anderson has recently traveled to Nashville to speak with legislators about drug prevention programs and initiatives implemented in Anderson County.

ASAP Staff was able to participate in youth development sessions and spend time meeting with Representative Ragan and Lt. Gov. McNally's staff. While in Nashville, ASAP staff members advocated and educated on expanding knowledge on the

dangers of Delta-8 packaging, funding for opioid alternatives, the dangers of Kratom, and vaping intervention programing.

Ambassadors advocated for restrictions on Delta-8 packaging, including banning cartoon characters and eye-catching colors on packaging. They reminded representatives that the National Poison Control reports that 77% of unintentional exposures on affected youth, 18 and younger.

Ambassadors educated legislators about the benefits of alternatives to opioids for Medicare patients, including chiropractic care, massage therapy, physical therapy, and local anesthetics.

Turning to these alternatives provides a 66.5% cost savings to taxpayers when no opioids are prescribed to treat acute pain according to the Prevention Alliance of Tennessee.

Ambassadors spoke with Ragan and Lt. Gov. McNally about implementing stricter guidelines to the

sale of Kratom advocating for an age limit for purchase as the FDA continues to investigate its properties.

Kratom is a drug native to Southeast Asia and performs in a sedative in low doses and stimulants in high doses. It is incredibly unpredictable and obtains similar characteristics to opiates.

ASAP works with the juveniles court system of Anderson County and Oak Ridge to streamline youth

vaping intervention. Students caught vaping get referred to ASAP's Vaping Prevention task that incorporates education for both students and parents about the harms of vaping.

ASAP has seen a decrease in repeat offenders and hopes to see a downward trend in vaping usage of our students.

ASAP staff also participated in the Youth Legislator Mock Session in a moderator capacity while other

youth actively applied their knowledge and skills to conduct the sessions.
